The Auxiliary provides additional support and services to hospital staff, patients, and the community. Since its inception, the Auxiliary has raised upwards of \$3 million for the hospital.

The Auxiliary's largest and longest-standing fundraising effort is the annual Ball of the Year, raising funds for vital programs and patient-focused projects such as Mon Health's Progressing Through Postpartum (P3) Program and most recently for the Caring Cottages. 
MILAN PUSKAR FOUNDATION DONATES \$300,000
