Elevator Safety and Emergency Procedures





General Elevator Safety Tips

- Prior to entering or exiting an elevator, watch your step.
 - * The elevator car may not be perfectly level with the floor.
- Stand clear of the doors.
 - * Keep clothes, hands, feet, equipment, beds, etc., away.
- Avoid crowding the elevator.
 - Wait for the next elevator if several people are in line and/or equipment is being transported.







Elevator Safety Tips Continued

- ♣ Push and hold the DOOR OPEN button if doors need to be held open or ask someone to push the button for you.
- Never try to stop a closing door with your body or equipment to prevent injury or misaligning the elevator door.
- If the doors do not open when the elevator stops, push the DOOR OPEN button.







If the Elevator Stops Between Floors

- First, do not panic. There is plenty of air in the elevator.
- Never climb out of a stalled elevator.
- Do not force open the elevator doors or attempt to leave the elevator.
- In the hospital, use the telephone button to alert the Console Attendant.
 - Wait for the maintenance team, elevator vendor, or fire department to arrive.
 - Note: The alarm bell button rings a local alarm.
- In off-site buildings, press the phone button to call for help.







If the Elevator Loses Power

- You will feel the elevator brakes engage. The elevator will stop abruptly and lock out.
- Push the telephone button to call for help.
- If you have another phone in the elevator (portable or cell phone), that may be utilized as well to call for assistance.
- Wait for the maintenance team, elevator vendor, or fire department to arrive to arrive to assist.








Use the Stairs During a Fire





Elevators on Emergency Power (MHMC) These elevators will run during loss of power.





Emergency Personnel Response

- *Emergency personnel may utilize tools upon their response to have complete control of the elevator.
- * The elevator is equipped with a Firefighter's Service mode.
- When activated, this:
 - Cancels all requests for elevator service,
 - Returns the elevator to the recall floor,
 - Opens the doors and keeps them open.
- The Fire service jewel indicates when this is activated.
- This is a light, not a button, within the elevators.
